

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Welcome to Connections, a component of the Westwood Shores Communications Network. In this short video, we're going to serve up commentary as to, how was my neighborhood watch zone placement determined? How do I know who my captain is? How do I know the boundaries for the neighborhood watch zones? and Why can't I edit by my own residence data?

Neighborhood Watch is a Community Group for all residents, with the mission of neighbors helping keep an eye out for each other. The group makes it easy to look up others emergency information in the community, to help them if a need arises. Westwood Shores Neighborhood Watch uses zoned areas for structure. First question you may ask, how was my neighborhood watch zone placement determined? Zones were determined by following an alignment with lots and streets, and then, where your lot falls within those designed parameters. Zones were designed for emergency support but do not dictate or limit your interactions with the community. No zone reassignments will be granted unless it is an error to already existing structured zones. Zones are mapped out using google maps and can be found in the site footer or within the Community Group.

How do I know who my captain is? They will, more than likely introduce themselves but within the Neighborhood Watch My Neighborhood listing their entry line will have a designation of NC. Why can't I edit my own residence data? You only need one completed entry per residence. An entry is set up within the lead owner's account based on the first name listed on the Trinity County Appraisal District T CAD record. When you are logged in with a Connections account and do not see a pencil icon next to your residence listing, you are not the lead resident account. If you want the main entry or editor to be transferred to a different resident, owner account, contact support.

Neighborhood Watch is a Community Group for all residents and should have a listing for all residences, but it may be missing the emergency data. You can locate your entry and edit your own data or file a Neighborhood Watch Application form for us to complete for you. The Connections Westwood Shores Neighborhood Watch Application form is in the pullout side drawer, navigation bar menu, and the App more menu.
